Requirements for conference proceedings

- Article title.** The title must fully reflect the subject and topic as well as the main goal set by the author. The title: 14 pt. CAPITAL LETTERS, 1.5 pt. line spacing, **bold**.
- Author names.** The last name/names must be given after the initials of the first/middle names (*P.S. Ivanov, S.I. Petrov, I.P. Sidorov*). 14 pt. and 1.5 pt. line spacing, *italics*
- Affiliation.** The official FULL name of the institution (without abbreviations). In English submissions, give the OFFICIAL ENGLISH NAME of the institution. The name of the institution should be followed by a comma on a new line and followed by the name of the city, country in brackets. 12 pt. and 1.5 pt. line spacing, *italics*
If authors from different institutions have contributed to the manuscript, institution names and authors' names should be concatenated by adding uppercase letter indices before institution names and after the names of corresponding authors.



4. **Abstract.** The abstract should be structured: contain the main provisions of the materials; reflect the author's view of the problem discussed, considering the analyzed material and the results obtained; allow the reader to understand the uniqueness of the research: how it differs from similar works. The abstract should contain 100 to 150 words, 12 pt. and 1.5 pt. line spacing.
5. **Keywords.** It is necessary to specify keywords, not more than 5-7, to be indexed in search engines.
6. A full text to be divided into meaningful parts and contain an introduction, the main part, and a conclusion; alignment in width, 12 pt. and 1.5 pt. line spacing.
7. **References**

In the text, references to the sources listed are given in square brackets: [Petrov 2019: 13].
The list of references is listed in alphabetical order.

Only published materials must be given in the reference list (references to Internet resources are allowed).

In the text, references to the sources listed are given in square brackets: [Petrov 2019: 13].

The volume including references, abstracts and keywords must not exceed:

- 6 pages;
- Microsoft Word *.doc extension;
- font – Times New Roman, size – 12 pt, line spacing – 1,0 pt;
- margin size:
 - upper margin 2.5 cm
 - bottom margin 2.5 cm
 - right margin 3 cm
 - left margin 3 cm
- paragraph indentation - 1 cm;
- the core text of the report: alignment on the width of the page
- acceptable ways to emphasize: only **bold** or/and *italic*;
- references (not more than 10 sources) should be typed after the main text in 10 font size under the title “References” (12 font) in alphabetical order, alignment of the text by width;
- tables and figures should be numbered and signed;
- the use of footnotes, numbered and bulleted lists, highlighting of the text with underlining to be **excluded**.

**Articles that do not meet the requirements will not be considered,
will not be accepted for consideration.**
